MINUTES – JULY 2 BOARD MEETING

Salon follow-up - Nineteen members did not participate in the Salon. For those who were not excused by early June, contact is being assigned to various Board members who will make calls to each. One volunteer job is assigned to non-excused members who could not offer legitimate excuses but still wish to remain MAG members. Pam has sent letters to all who did not participate but has not received any responses.

Salon Event - There are five awards that need to be delivered. Norma H has them and will make arrangements. It is hoped that recipients of awards will write their thank you notes as soon as possible. There will be a Salon committee meeting to assess various aspects of the Salon and to rework the details of the Salon procedure.

Nominating Committee – Sue Lewis is contacting David Carpenter to confirm whether he is willing to accept the nomination as Vice President.

Art Fair on the Square update – The packets have been dispersed among the six participating members. There has been a dry run for setting up the tents, and participants are more aware of how to work with the display units to display their work.

Treasurer's Report – Susan Baez stated that there is \$14,278.78 in the treasury. Not all bills from the Salon are in yet.

Other Business - (a) Yearbook - Since Charmaine Harbort has developed a complete Excel listing for all members, the feasibility of adapting this to the directory listing of the yearbook was discussed. Norma will talk with Marcia and Charmaine about the possibilities of using this method to attain accuracy.

(b) New Membership Jurying – Cindy reported that it is scheduled for Saturday, August 18. Clearing up the question of how many members are leaving MAG will help to determine how many artists MAG can accept. There is a 140 member ceiling.

(c) Waivers need to be sent to new members. The group from last year must have waivers mailed to them.

(d) Bylaws change – Questions have arisen in inquiries regarding new membership. It may be necessary to revise the bylaws to read, “Membership in Madison Art Guild (MAG) is open to any artist, amateur or professional, who lives in Dane County, Wisconsin *and is eighteen years old or older.*”

(e) Newsletter – Norma explained the difficulty of space issues with running applications for Art Fairs repeatedly in the newsletter. Motion was made by Cindy that applications be made available in the newsletter by means of links rather than the printed form. For those members who do not have computers it is possible to call the show coordinator to have forms sent directly to them. Kris seconded the motion. Motion carried.

(f) Salon Pick-up – Pick-up is scheduled for Saturday, July 28, 9-11. There will be no early pick-ups.

Agenda for August 6th meeting – 1) Final membership reporting, 2) Salon financial report, 3) Annual calendar to be developed by Sue Lewis and Kris Kellor.
