Oakwood Village Opportunity

The art therapy intern at Oakwood Village University in Madison is looking for artists interested in doing an art presentation or demonstration sometime the week of April 8-12. The Arts Festival week at Oakwood Village will incorporate artists from a variety of backgrounds, disciplines and mediums, from 2D visual artists, to sculptors, to authors, poets, musicians, etc. Presentations, performances, and demos will range from 45 minutes to 1 hour. An audience will range from 20-80 participants depending on the artists and the location. Most presenters will have an "audience" of 30-40 people.

They are also looking for artists to lead art workshops with hands on learning that might last one hour and 15 minutes, as well as artists willing to demo for 45 minutes over the lunch hour (between 11-1 each day) as sort of "street performers" in a common space that will allow our residents to gather to experience the art more organically.

Time slots are at 10 am, 1 pm, 3 pm, and 7 pm. Art subject matter is open. Talk about your favorite artist or one that influenced you, your particular medium, or do a demonstration. February 15, 2024
